### **Invitation**

You are cordially invited to attend the International Symposium and the 3<sup>rd</sup> Iwasawa Conference on Catalysis and Surface Science for Efficient Utilization of Carbon Resources and Related Topics, which will be held from December 2 to 5, 2011 in the State Key Laboratory of Physical Chemistry of Solid Surfaces (PCOSS), Xiamen University, China.

The symposium will include scientific program, social events and local tours. The program will emphasize the important role of catalysis and surface science in defining the chemistry required for sustainable growth of society. All contributions are made in English. The past two Iwasawa conferences were held in Tokyo (2009) and Sapporo (2010) and have earned a good reputation as an academic event for researchers across the disciplines to discuss current developments in catalysis, surface science and related topics.

The State Key Laboratory of PCOSS would be responsible for local transportation and tours in Xiamen. All lunches and dinners during the Symposium will be served.

### **Scientific Program**

The scientific program will consist of invited lectures, oral presentations and poster presentations.

### **Extended Abstracts**

Those who wish to present papers are requested to submit a one-page abstract

(single line spacing on A4 or 8" × 11" size paper) including figures and tables. Title should be centered with 14 pt times bold, followed by author(s), affiliation(s), address (es) and email address of a corresponding author (11 pt times, centered), then the text should be written with 11 pt times, involving references indicated by superscript of Arabic number.

Desirable mode of presentation (oral or poster) is requested to indicate at the upper right corner of the abstract. Selection of paper and the mode of presentation will be decided by the Organizing Committee based on the abstracts. The selected abstracts will be printed in their original form and distributed at the Reception Desk. The abstracts must be received by Prof. Youzhu Yuan or Prof. Satoru Takakusagi (Japanese only) by October 31, 2011. Notice of acceptance will be sent by the Organizing Committee to the authors by November 8, 2011.

### **Youth Session**

About 5 young scientists and students who were born later than January 1st, 1976 will be granted with RMB6,000 to partially cover the expenses to attend the symposium. They are requested to give oral presentations. Awardees will be selected by PCOSS and Prof. Iwasawa.
